and it will be rejected by the court. Judges will examine your forms and check the results. Do not waste your time and money. Do it right the first time because you will be paying a fee to a lawyer to help you.

Qualified Additional Dependents

If you have them, you can claim them which may affect the child support result. If you have a child with an ex and you must pay child support for that child by order of the court, you may NOT claim the child as a QAD. You must advise how much you are actually paying in child support.

Do not provide a phony number for your own income either. The judge may ask to see your W2 from the prior year. A negative number is not allowed. Sometimes self-employed individuals will claim so many deductions that they have a net-loss of income (farmers). **If you are estimating a number, make sure you indicate "Estimate"!**
